**SDOS Birding Walks Risk Assessment Form:** A composite risk assessment for Hollingbury Wild Park LNR area, including the golf course, woodlands, and adjacent downland.

Location: Hollingbury Wild Park LNR; Hollingbury Park Golf Course, Hollingbury Camp and associated Burstead woodlands. This also includes the downland edge of the golf course, the focus for butterfly and botanical walks, in which case park at TQ324084.

Brief Description: A **downland walk** at the edge of the golf course. Additional walks are possible across the golf course, sometimes combined with short stretches of woodland. Some inclines and slopes, mostly on good paths.

For an advertised golf course walks, you must adhere to the parking restrictions, which means that you might have to park on Ditchling road or nearby roads such as Woodbourne Avenue and Cuckmere Way. There is space for five cars as you turn off Ditchling Road into the approach road to the club house.

Suggested clothing: This walk is most likely a spring and early summer outing, so suitable clothing for the prevailing conditions is required. Good walking shoes or boots, especially after heavy rain. Long trousers probably better than shorts.
