## **SDOS Birding Walks Risk Assessment Form:**

Assessor: Tony Benton : Date of Assessment 12 April 2023

Location: Cissbury from the south

**Brief Description:** "This walk passes through a classic downland landscape for its whole length, with the exception of the inauspicious start in the Lyons Farm Retail Park. The mid-April timing is designed to catch the sweet spot between when birds such as whitethroats, corn buntings and yellowhammers are in full song and when leaf cover is complete making observation more difficult.

On the way up to Cissbury Ring we walk along the hidden gem of Lychpole Hill, and then have lunch right next to the 'fenced off yews' on the Ring. These are often referred to in birding reports, and are known spots for Ring Ouzels (and Wrynecks) on passage. We would be very lucky indeed to see either species, but a variety of raptors are likely, as is a raven or two at some point.

Note the length of the walk - 5.2 miles in total - but this is split by lunch and the going is easy. The climb up to the Ring is easier than the climb up from the Findon Valley side. With an early start of 8:30 we should be comfortably back by 1.30pm.

**Parking** is at the side of Currys BN14 9FB. There is room for 7 or 8 cars here, just beyond a white mobile food van. Please park on the right only as this is the access road to the back of Sainsbury's. Once these spaces are gone, the manager of Currys has suggested that it would be OK to park in the car park to the front of the store but if you choose to do this then as a courtesy we would suggest that you park towards the back, further away from the store entrance. We will meet by the mobile food van."

**Brief description of the risks:** Generally a low risk walk, but some slippery surfaces and mud will be encountered, as will the occasional car or farm vehicle. Speeding cyclists are also a hazard on an early section of the walk. Really good footwear is essential. A walking pole might help some people.

**Suggested clothing:** Warm, waterproof clothing depending on weather conditions; strong footwear or wellington boots. For the April 2023 walk, walking boots as a minimum are recommended.
