Location: Newtimber Hill

The path to Newtimber Hill is from the Wildflower Café. The café is located at NT Saddlescombe Farm off the Saddlescombe Road, which is the road from Poynings to Brighton. There is a small car park on the west side of the road. Parking for approximately 15 cars. Please avoid the deeply rutted area in the car park. Participants should take great care when crossing the road. Cross with care and avoid the blind corner

**Advisory Notice:** all participants are asked to read this document carefully. Walk leaders are not provided with First Aid kits, nor are they expected to be First Aid trained. All participants must take this into account and must also bring with them any medication that might be required.

**Brief Description:** Newtimber Hill is steep in places and some people with mobility problems could find themselves challenged. Similarly people with cardio or breathing difficulties could find some of the slopes challenging.

**Suggested Clothing:** Stout walking shoes, sunhat, sunscreen. Sandals are not recommended. This walk is most likely as a spring or summer outing but waterproof clothing may be necessary, depending on the weather conditions.
